



The contemporary site of Auchen Castle is located to the north east and key views likely relate to views towards the castle and the surrounding fields. Peripheral and distant views to the south west and south incorporate the large scale commercial forestry plantations and a large number of turbines from the operational Harestanes Windfarm. The additional blade tips and hubs to the south would slightly elongate the array of existing turbines from the operational Harestanes Windfarm. The magnitude of impact has been assessed as Negligible Adverse to an asset of High value, with very minor changes to setting with the introduction of blade tips and hubs in the context of commercial forestry and the operational Harestanes Windfarm. Intervening localised vegetation would have some impact on these views. These changes are unlikely to impact on the ability to understand and appreciate the fabric and nature of the settlement. Key views likely relate to intervisibility with other nearby forts and settlements, with viewsheds to the south and south west already incorporating the operational Harestanes Windfarm in the distant background. Peripheral and distant views to the south and south west incorporate the large scale commercial forestry plantations and a large number of turbines from the operational Harestanes Windfarm. The additional blade tips and hubs to the south would slightly elongate the array of existing turbines from the operational Harestanes Windfarm. The magnitude of impact has been assessed as Negligible Adverse to an asset of High value, with very minor changes to setting with the introduction of blade tips and hubs in the context of commercial forestry and the operational Harestanes Windfarm. Intervening localised vegetation would have some impact on these views. These changes are unlikely to impact on the ability to understand and appreciate the fabric and nature of the fort.
